## Abstract:

We develop a general quantitative framework to study interactions of international trade and greenhouse gas emissions. The framework includes realistic features of natural resources, fossil fuel markets, carbon accounting, climate change policy, and trade policy. We apply the framework to account for each country's carbon emissions according to production, consumption, and extraction; to quantify trade's full effect on greenhouse gas emissions; and to study counterfactual changes in trade and environmental policies.
